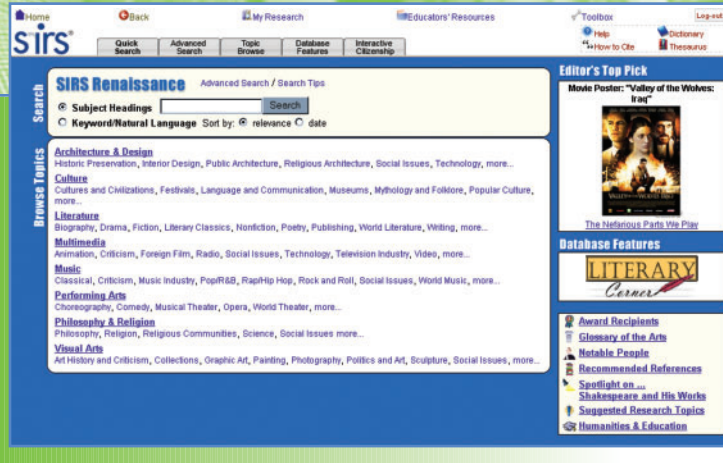

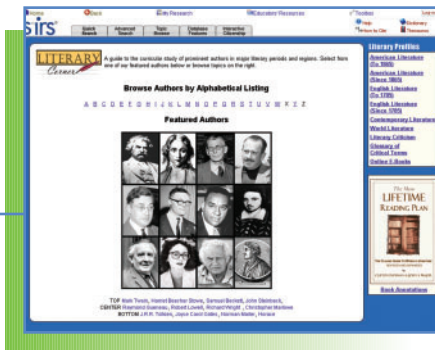

## SIRS Renaissance Literary Corner

SIRS Renaissance Literary Corner is a guide to the curricular study of prominent authors and poets in major literary periods and regions worldwide. Comprised of Literary Profiles, Literary Criticism, Online E-Books, a Glossary of Critical Terms, and *The New Lifetime Reading Plan*, the Literary Corner offers a wealth of information of interest to learners at all levels.

Literary Profiles presents a study guide of prominent U.S. and international authors and poets during major literary periods. Each profile provides biographical information on the author and critical analysis of his or her works; many author profiles are supplemented with photos or illustrations.

In addition, critical writings by well-known authors, including Robert Louis Stevenson, Henry James, and William Dean Howells, add a dimension of traditional literary authority.

Literary Criticism contains more than 500 full-text articles offering in-depth critical and analytical perspectives on literature.

The Glossary of Critical Terms elucidates common literary genres and terms, categorized into six subtopics: drama, fiction, movements, nonfiction, poetry, and regions.

The Online E-Books feature supplements the database with links to many electronic books. The Renaissance Literary Corner is designed to meet the needs of literature students and will continue to develop and expand.

Finally, *The New Lifetime Reading Plan* offers brief introductions to more than 130 literary classics and includes biographical information on the creators of these works. Additionally, the "Going Further" section includes synopses of 100 additional notable 20th-century writers and their works.
